1. Introduction

Thank you for choosing one of our fonts!

1.1 Requirements

The minimum requirements for using the font are:

- a machine with a running operating system
- a text editor of your choice
- the *mqsd.zip* file

1.2 Font Files

Unzip the *mqsd.zip* file somewhere on your computer. The contents of the font folder should be:

- *mqsd.ttf*
- *userguide.pdf*
- *license.txt*

1.3 License

The MQSD font is free for both personal and commercial use. Enjoy!

2. Font Installation

2.1 Windows

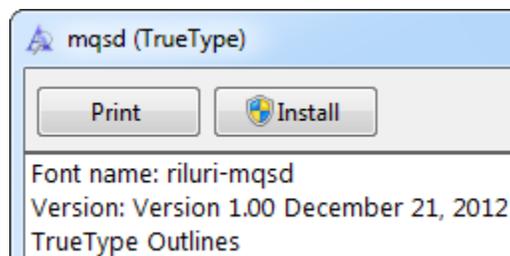
-  Windows is able to manage approximately 1000 fonts.
-  Applications usually have to load all installed fonts in order to run so avoid having too many fonts installed at once.

2.1.1 Windows 7, 8 and Vista

Unzip the *mqs*d.zip file somewhere on your computer.

Option 1: Select the *mqs*d.ttf file and *Right-click > Install*

Option 2: Open the *mqs*d.ttf file and click  Install Font



2.1.2 Other versions of Windows

Unzip the *mqs*d.zip file somewhere on your computer.

Copy the *mqs*d.ttf file into the *Fonts* folder, usually located in *C:\Windows* or *C:\WINNT*

2.2 Mac OS



Mac OS X recognizes *TrueType* (.ttf) and *OpenType* (.otf) fonts but not the *PC bitmap* (.fon) fonts.

2.2.1 Mac OS X or above

Unzip the *mqsdsd.zip* file somewhere on your computer.

Open the *mqsdsd.ttf* file and click **Install font**

2.2.2 Other versions of Mac OS X

Unzip the *mqsdsd.zip* file somewhere on your computer.

Option 1: If you want the font installed for all users copy the *mqsdsd.ttf* file into the */Library/Fonts* folder.

Option 2: If you want the font installed for you only copy the *mqsdsd.ttf* file into the */Users/Your_username/Library/Fonts* folder.

2.2.3 Mac OS 9 or earlier



This version is not supported by default so you have to convert the font before using it.

Unzip the *mqsdsd.zip* file somewhere on your computer.

Convert the *mqsdsd.ttf* file using one of the tools available here:

<http://www.dafont.com/soft.php#2>

Drag the *converted* font file into the *System* folder and you will be prompted with the option to add it to the *Fonts* folder.

2.3 Linux

Unzip the `mqsds.zip` file somewhere on your computer.

Option 1: Copy the `mqsds.ttf` to `fonts://` in the File Manager.

Option 2: Go into the `/home` folder, select `View > Show Hidden Files` from the menu, then copy the `mqsds.ttf` file in hidden `.fonts` folder. If the folder does not exist, create it.

3. Using the Font

3.1 With a Software

You may need to relaunch the target application in order to use a new font.

Proceed as usual. The font should appear in your software's font combo-box.

3.2 For a Website

 If a webpage uses a font that is not installed on the visitor's machine, it will be replaced with the browser's default font.

Embed the font in your webpages using the CSS3 `@font-face` property.

3.3 In Emails & Instant Messengers

 Your correspondent can only view the fonts installed on his/her computer.

If possible, avoid sending an email or an instant message using a non-standard font.

Make sure your correspondent also has the font installed. Otherwise he/she will see the message with the default font.

3.4 Nothing is Working

Step 1: Relaunch the target application after installing the font.

- if the problem persists -

Step 2: Make sure you copied the *mqsdt.ttf* file (and not the *mqsdt.zip* file) into the *Fonts* folder.

- if the problem persists -

Step 3: Restart your computer.
